## Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

In our first reading today, we hear a familiar story. God comes to Solomon in a dream and says to him "Ask something of me and I will give it to you." Solomon ponders the request, does some soul searching and ultimately asks for an understanding heart. God, pleased with the request, immediately grants it to him.

Which, of course, begs the question to us: If God came before us and issued the same request, how would we respond? Solomon does not ask for riches or success or territory. Instead, he looks within at what he personally lacks - the wisdom to lead a vast people - and he asks for God to help with that. Solomon's answer was self-aware. He knew what his blind spots were and he asked God to assist him in those areas.

I had a chance to sit down with Isaiah Grybush yesterday. Isaiah is a FOCUS missionary set to begin his second year at Ball State University this fall reaching out to college-aged students. We were talking about the ancient practice of Lectio Divina. This is a practice which invites someone to slowly read a small portion of Scripture - perhaps a paragraph only - three to four times repeatedly, with time for silence and meditation in between each reading. Each time the person is asking "What captures my heart?" within that short reading. And in answering that question, that is one way we see God speaking to us.

The same question can be asked with the story from Solomon - or with the Gospel reading of Jesus telling the parable of finding

a treasure in the field and selling all we have to purchase it. What captures our heart? When we truly search within us, what is it we desire? What is it we lack? What would we sell everything we have to purchase? Fame? Security? Success? Companionship? Health? Time? Intelligence?

I'm not sure any of those answers, in and of themselves, are bad answers. The crux of the matter, however, lies in the reasoning. What is the intention behind our answer? What is our focus? Is it desirous - even at a small level - of bringing attention and glory to ourselves? Or is it to give glory to God? Do we answer out of fear or lack of faith? Is our answer designed to bring comfort or status to us? Or do we answer with the express purpose of using that gift to build God's kingdom? What captures our heart?

Solomon knew he had been called to lead the chosen people of God. He knew he lacked the ability to lead such a vast people. So he asked for God's wisdom to assist with that mission, not so he could be viewed as the wisest person alive, but so that he could honor the task given from God - to lead His chosen people.

God has given each of us a task as well. We may feel we lack the ability to accomplish it. So did Solomon. But in order to accomplish the mission before us, we first must choose it. It must capture our heart. God puts the request out there before us. So what will we ask for?
