Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

I want to write about forgiveness today. But before I do, I want to be up front with you – I struggle with this virtue to which we are called in today's readings. So as I write, I speak to myself as much as to all of you.

One cannot read today's readings without hearing the call to forgive. Sirach mentions it time and again in the first reading – just using different examples. One such reads: "Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins?"

In the Gospel, Peter continues the theme by asking Jesus "How often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Make no mistake, Peter is being magnanimous in this gesture. In fact, I would go so far as to say that few of us in reality have been so generous. Jesus, of course, corrects him and says – "...not seven times, but seventy-seven times."

Peter is essentially asking Jesus – when can I get to the end of forgiveness and just go back to life as normal? And Jesus essentially answers – never. We either live in the state of forgiveness or we live in the state of judgment. There is no middle ground.

I like judgment much better. It comes more natural to me. Not only does it give me what seems like the moral high ground, it makes me feel powerful and in control. Didn't Jesus just last week say that as believers whatever we held bound on earth will be bound in heaven? That gives me a whole lot of power and control, doesn't it? And

which one of us, when we are being honest with ourselves, doesn't like that? I get to feel morally superior and hold you in your sin – and do it all in the name of religion.

Then Jesus comes along with this week's reading and blows that game out of the water. When I act out of judgment and moral superiority, the only one I am holding bound is myself. I live in a space of judging others so I expect others to do it to me. I live in a place of credits and debits – better and worse – and that is a zero-sum game. Someone wins and someone loses. And sooner or later, that will be me.

We either live in forgiveness or judgment. I know I have done a lot of foolish things in my life. I've said things I regret and I've done things I wish I hadn't. I suspect you are no different. But you know what? We are not our worst day. We are not our worst action. We are not our most foolish utterance. There is more to us than that, thank God. And that same thing is true of those who have hurt us. They are more than that action or word. And forgiveness offers us and them a chance to prove that – to others, to God, maybe mostly to ourselves. We are more than those voices in our heads that condemn us. And so are those we hold in judgment.

Jesus puts before us today life and death and invites us to choose. Forgiveness or judgment? Saint John XXIII, the pope who called together the Second Vatican Council, once said "See everything, overlook a great deal, correct a little." That's a man who lived out of forgiveness. May we do likewise.
