There are more refugees and internally displaced youth now – over 65 million – than at any other time in recorded history. Our faith calls us to "love our neighbor," to see Christ in those who are in greatest need, and to welcome newcomers seeking the security, peace, and opportunity they cannot find in their home countries.

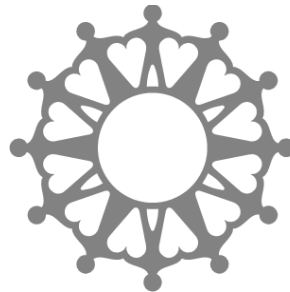
We can join Pope Francis and the Church around the world, and share the journey with fellow children of God by:
