



Cup O' Joe

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

It's somewhat easy for me to read our first reading this weekend and look down upon the actions and words of the Hebrew people. Imagine this: they had just been freed from their Egyptian oppressors, with whom they had lived in slavery for hundreds of years. In the midst of that incredible time, they witnessed God's wondrous works – from the 10 plagues to the parting of the Red Sea. Yet here they are in our reading, dreaming of the “good old days” back in Egypt. At least there, they had food to eat. Here, there was certain death in the desert. How short their memory was.

Yet in spite of it all, I marvel at the courage of the Hebrew people to air their dirty laundry within Scripture. This episode was not put down in writing until centuries later – but they didn't try to sugar coat how they acted. They admitted to themselves and the whole world that their faith in God was faltering. And in doing so, they give us permission to do the same. On those rare occasions when we are honest enough with ourselves to really see who we are and how we trust – and when we are able to share this with those around us - we see ourselves alongside the Hebrew people in the desert. We are them and they are us.

How often God has done wondrous things in my life, yet it rarely seems

enough. I keep looking for more. When I take time to look at the landscape of my life, I see blessing upon blessing. Yet I am certain that destruction lies just around the next unseen corner. Has God led me to this place only to desert me? What is going on within me that I find it so hard to trust?

Perhaps that is why the Hebrew people were God's chosen. They lived the human condition in its fullness – even when it looked ugly. And they weren't afraid to put it out there for all to see. Yet God never left them, even when living their humanity in a most untrusting and base way. Instead, he gives them bread from heaven in response to their doubt. And, of course, God will never leave us. Instead, he will feed us in unlikely ways from unforeseen sources. And in doing so, he will call us to further trust him, one day at a time.

Question for Reflection: How has God been faithful to you? What are the signs of God's care in your life?

Action Response: Can you hand over your future to God and trust him to be there? That may be a bit much for all of us. Let's start smaller. Hand over to him the next hour...or the next day. And see where God shows up.


