

Celebrate with us!



This past Thursday, October 11, we celebrated the feast day of St. John XXIII, the pope who called together the entire Church for the Second Vatican Council. What is unique about this date is that most saints have their feast day celebrated on the date of their death. Not so with John XXIII. His date coincides with the opening date of the Council in 1962 – October 11.

John XXIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli in 1881 to a farming family in northern Italy. After his ordination at the age of 23, he was sent to Rome to study Canon Law, although while doing so he acted in many other roles (as bishops secretary, teaching history at the seminary). When WWI broke out, he served as a stretcher bearer. This experience gave him a first-hand view of war and made an indelible mark on his life.

Following his time in Rome (c. 1925), he served as a Papal diplomat, serving in countries such as Bulgaria, Turkey and, finally, France. While in Turkey, with the help of Germany's ambassador, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people.

In 1953, Roncalli was made a Cardinal. And in 1958, after Pope Pius XII died (who had served as pope for 19 years), it was thought best to elect a bridge pope, meaning someone who would not be in the office long and allow for the Church to breath before another pope stepped in for a lengthy period. Roncalli was elected and he took his name, John, after his father and St. John Lateran.

Roncalli took his work seriously, but not himself. His wit was on display for all (e.g. "Anyone can be Pope; the proof of this is that I have become one."). John was humble, quick to

listen and his presence exuded goodness and joy. He unleashed hope simply by being who he was. And his presence was viewed by many as a grandfather to the world.

But after he experienced a vision 9 days into his papacy, three months later, on the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, John XXIII called for a worldwide ecumenical council. There was not a crisis in the Church, so why call a council? That is the question that hung in the air for three years, and would only be answered during his incredible opening speech of October 11, 1962.

This speech was addressed to the entire world and invited the church to *aggiornamento*: bringing it up to date where required. God, he said, was active in both the Church and the world, and he invited us all to read the signs of the times and listen to and learn from the world as well as the Church. He wanted to engage with the world using new avenues to spread the Gospel. And he would do so with the medicine of mercy, not condemnations.

This speech, perhaps more than any other act of his papacy, set the tone for Vatican II – one of the most important gatherings in the history of our Church. Yet John would not live to see the end. He died on June 3, 1963, having witnessed only the first of four sessions. Paul VI would lead it to its conclusion.

"Consult not your fears but your hopes and your dreams. Think not about your frustrations, but about your unfulfilled potential. Concern yourself not with what you tried and failed in, but what it is still possible for you to do."

St. John XXIII, pray for us.

Next weekend we will celebrate World Mission Sunday, a day we recommit ourselves to our common vocation through Baptism, to be missionary disciples. It is one Sunday for the Whole World. Pope Francis calls all children of God to be "voices for mission." Places like Uganda where people face food uncertainty and violence...in the Philippines where local clergy face martyrdom...in Oceania where people's livelihoods are threatened by climate change...and in remote regions of Latin America where people are hearing the Gospel for the first time. We speak up through our prayers and personal sacrifices for our brothers and sisters. Please keep the Missions in your prayers and please be generous.

Day of Prayer for Atonement & Healing

It seems that every one of us has been touched in some way by the sexual abuse scandal within our Church. We hurt, we grieve, we question, we are angered, we feel numb.

In an effort to come together as a community, to mourn and pray for those hurt by this terrible injustice, I have set aside Friday, November 2 (the Feast of All Souls), as a Day of Prayer for Atonement and Healing. This day will begin and end with Mass, the Eucharist will be exposed and this action will take place at each of our three linked parishes.

Our Church is hurting – it has sinned – and we must clothe ourselves in sackcloth and ashes and come before our God asking for His mercy and grace during this time of mourning.




