

# WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

OCTOBER 21,2018

If your faith journey sometimes may feel like it has hit a plateau, and seems to be stalled, you are not alone. Many great saints have felt the same way. St. Theresa of Kalcutta called it "The Dark Night of the Soul." I would tend to say: "If you've never experienced it, then it could mean that you have become complacent with where you are at, and need to do something to propel your faith journey. Whatever you do, don't try to bargain with God: "If you do this for me, I will do that for you." You may be asking for more than you bargained for.

That's what happened to James and John in this weekend's Gospel. They came to Jesus and said to Him: "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." After Jesus asked them what they wanted, they said: "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus then asked them: "Are you ready to follow the same path as I do in suffering and death?"; (paraphrased) They said yes they could, but they really didn't understand what they were saying "Yes" to.

Then again, do any of us realize the full impact of what our parents and Godparents agreed to for us when we were baptized? Do any of us fully realize that; through our baptism, being anointed as priest, prophet, and king, requires that we also must be willing to die with Christ? We may not face an immediate physical death, but it does mean that we should become less self-centered; that we should always be open to the needs of others.

We know through the writings of Scripture, that the same James and John who said "Yes we can" endure the same path to suffering and death as Jesus would endure, did also suffer martyrdom.

Now, you may say, if you know Scripture; "James died as a martyr for his faith by being beheaded, but John didn't because he died on the Island of Patmos of natural causes." This is true, but an attempt to kill him by poisoning failed and then he was exiled to die on that island. And there, tradition has it, he wrote the Book of Revelation.

A recent reflection I listened to described James' Martyrdom as "Red Martyrdom," (shedding of blood) and John's as a "White Martyrdom," (dying of natural causes for faith). Most of us will unlikely die a "Red Martyrdom" for our faith. But all of us should be willing to die a "White Martyrdom" for our faith. That should be our goal in life, because through our baptism, "we die to our worldly life so we can rise with Christ." We let go of our own needs to focus on the needs of others. This is what is required of us to lead Saintly lives.

To quote Pope Francis in his recent homily for the beatification of Saint Oscar Romero, Pope Saint Paul VI, and the others: "Let us ask ourselves where we are in our story of love with God. Do we content ourselves with a few commandments or do we follow Jesus as lovers, really prepared to leave behind something for him?" the pope asked. "Today Jesus invites us to return to the source of joy, which is the encounter with him, the courageous choice to risk everything to follow him, the satisfaction of leaving something behind in order to embrace his way. The saints have travelled this path," he continued. "Let us ask for the grace always to leave things behind for love of the Lord: to leave behind wealth, the yearning for status and power, structures that are no longer adequate for proclaiming the Gospel, those weights that slow down our mission, the strings that tie us to the world."




